



USS Montrose (APA 212) Finds A New Home Port

Here is a picture of what Bob said about the first thing we saw as we checked into our motel. Most of you are familiar with the Montrose visual call sign, NPPP. I had a chance to take Bob's picture while I got into the shot as well (check out the reflection in the window of the selfie in reverse).

There were more than 150 citizens of Montrose who turned out at the Warrior Resource Center for the program where Bob presented the scale model of USS Montrose (APA 212) to the city and county of Montrose. The Adjutant General of the Colorado National Guard even flew in from Denver for the occasion. He's the guy up front in his flight suit. The Montrose High School Junior NROTC provided the color guard.

Veterans from the area, City Officials, County Officials as well as General Edwards and his Chief of Staff CSGM Lawrence were on hand for the ceremony. I was asked to speak, and thanked the city, county and citizens for its support to veterans, introduced our crewmembers, and presented the USS Montrose Replica to the city and county. There was also a special presentation of an eagle cane to Jim McDermott, a Montrose crewmember from the 60's who lives near Montrose and whose brother lives in Montrose and makes the eagle cane. Jim was very surprised. Following the ceremony the County of Montrose provided a buffet for all to enjoy. We were able to visit with the veterans and guests and share many military memories.

On Sunday the 15th the crew of the Montrose and their families were invited to a reception at the home of Judy Ann Files. This gesture really describes the City of Montrose. Judy Ann, her family and friend's provided an awesome reception with delicious food, drink and hospitality.

It was also at this event that Emily Smith from Warrior Resource Center presented two of our Korean Veterans with a very special gift. The South Korean government has prepared a book containing pictures and articles from the Korean War and present South Korea to be given to Korean Veterans as a way of saying Thank You. Our two Korean Veterans present were Pat Duval and Arnold Wegher were overwhelmed and presentation did bring a tear to one's eye.

On Monday the 16th, with the help of Ralph, Judy Ann's husband, the replica of the USS Montrose got underway from the Warrior Resource Center and sailed to Montrose City Council Chambers.
